Dog Owners:

As a reminder, the City of Madison has ordinance requirements regarding dogs:

- Do not allow your dog to bark at, intimidate, attack, or threaten a person or another pet.
- ALWAYS carry equipment sufficient to clean up your dog's feces when you and your dog are off your property.
- Do not allow dog feces to accumulate on your property.
- Provide shelter from sun, wind and precipitation whenever your dog is kept outside.

Landscaping in High Point Estates

HOA Landscaping Plans for 2017

High Point Estates has two significant landscaping renovations planned for 2017. The Board has been interested in adding some "wow" factor to our entrances as well as improving the maintenance of the High Point Road berm. The entry project is spurred by the beautiful entry medians of nearby developments such as Blackhawk and parts of Hawk's Landing as well as our own renovation last year of the High Point Road / New Washburn median. The Board believes we can add value to our neighborhood through colorful plantings in our entry medians. The High Point Road berm has seen some decline in its plantings, mostly through the recent death of several large trees as well as neglect of the semi-circle rock formations. Our 2017 projects seek to renovate the Gammon / New Washburn entry median as well as spruce up the plantings on the High Point Road berm.

The Gammon /New Washburn entry median will undergo the same type of renovation we did last year at the High Point Road / New Washburn entry median. The grass will be dug up and replaced with topsoil and a mulch covered planting bed. The two ends of the median will have 4-5 foot beds for colorful annual plantings and the center portion of the median will have perennial shrubs and flowering plants added. The two trees currently in the median will be retained. When complete, this should add a nice splash of color to our Gammon Road entrance. (Looking further ahead, the Welton Drive / High Point Road median will be similarly renovated in 2018.)

Three of the rock semi-circles on High Point Road will get replacement trees for crab apples that have perished over the last few years. Additionally, we will take out the decorative rock in all five semi-circles and replace it with grass. This will provide better weed control as well as lower maintenance costs. Additionally, several trees and shrubs will be planted as replacements for the large trees that have perished (storm damage or needlecast fungus) over the last three years.

The HOA will also continue to spray all evergreen trees on the berm and in the traffic circles to control needlecast fungus as well as spray all crab apple trees in the same areas for crab apple blight. We recommend homeowners consider spraying their own trees as both afflictions are prevalent in the area.

The HOA will also continue to provide general landscape maintenance service in all common areas through our contract with Glacier Landscaping. If you have any questions, comments or recommendations, please let the head of our Landscaping committee know at craigthompson608@gmail.com.
