### Sign up!

Keeping our streets leaf-free before the rain can have a Ripple Effect on our waters! Sign up to receive alerts reminding you when rain is on the way and it's time to take action. Alerts will be <u>texted</u> 1-2 days before a rain event reminding you that it's time to remove street leaves. *Alerts will only be sent between Oct. 1st – Nov. 30th* during peak leaf fall.

\*\*\*This program is only available to Dane County residents or businesses.\*\*\*

Rain that runs off roofs, land and pavement travels through storm sewers and ditches to our lakes, rivers and streams.

Stormwater runoff carries excess nutrients like phosphorus with it, which can **turn your lakes green and smelly.** 

The way to protect and clean your lakes and streams is to make sure only rain—and nothing else, including leaves —goes into the storm drains and ditches!
